In 1997 in Greenville (Embassy Suites) it was agreed for counties to make flags (3' X 5'), materials of your choice, 2 1/2 inch sleeve on 3 foot side, 8 foot pole, 1 1/4 inch diameter pole and gold colored stand. The first time we had a procession was at White Oak Conference in 1998. Locate your county flag and bring it to West Columbia, October 12.

Covid-19 put us on the sideline temporarily, but during that time we had two Kershaw members join the Walk South Carolina Program. We are looking toward a bright future in July when we will assemble again with club meetings.

#### **Orangeburg County**

Orangeburg County FCL held our 2020 board meeting on March 10 and made plans for our yearly activities, but soon after that COVID-19 came into our area and we were unable to continue meeting and carrying out some of our plans. We were able to donate a total of \$350.00 to five community agencies serving the public and to the Orangeburg County 4-H program.

In April 2020, our members made and donated 75 masks to workers cleaning up after serious storm damage.

For SCFCL Give Hope, our county contributed 58 bags filled with personal care items, blankets, games and toys suitable for women and children. We had planned to give these bags to Casa Family Services in Orangeburg, but due to COVID-19 restrictions, they were not able to accept donations at that time. Instead, we gave them to the Samaritan House in Orangeburg, which is a homeless shelter.

We have missed being able to fellowship together and are glad all 11 members have rejoined. Since we have not been meeting due to the pandemic as well as other health problems, copies of this year's education lessons have been distributed to each of our members so they can benefit from this information.

One of our clubs hopes to resume meeting in September. It will be great to be able to attend the state meeting in October.

#### **Richland County**

Richland County FCL wishes all members a Happy 100th Anniversary. We have come a long way and performed many, many community assistance projects over the years. The pandemic has hampered our club meetings and projects but we hope to revitalize as conditions improve.

# 2021 - 2022 State Project

WalkSC is a 12-week online program allowing participants to virtually walk trails across South Carolina while staying in the comforts of their home communities. The program was initially designed for any age adult with no medical issues that would prevent a regular walking routine. Through this pilot program, plans are currently geared toward adults age 55+ who are not currently active but interested in becoming active by establishing a regular walking plan.

WalkSC was created by the Clemson University Extension Service Rural Health and Nutrition Team.

#### **Laurens County**

Our county, like all the other counties, came to a halt with the Covid-19 virus hit. Our last meeting in person was in March 2020. We meet at a church and the church closed its doors to public meetings. Since that time our members have tried to stay in contact either by phone or by sending cards.

Virginia Thompson made about 65 masks for Martha Franks Retirement Center nurses, Kathy Duncan and Sally Longway made masks for family and friends.

In October 2020 we lost one of our faithful members, Susan Stevens. Before she died, she had made over 200 masks for family and friends. We have carried items to the Memorial Home for the Ages, Laurens Crisis Center, and the Safe Home store.

Carroll Traynham continues to work with Tiny Trotters Therapy Horses. These are small horses that are used in campaigns like "Just say whoa to bullying" and other special need awareness.

Sally Longway and Margie Patterson have been busy quilting. They have made lap quilts for a nursing home in Fountain Inn, SC, Quilts of Valor for veterans and children's quilts to be given out by the Simpsonville Police Department.

Marilyn Easter wrote a grant through Dairy Alliance for a cooler for United Ministries and was given a \$2600.00 cooler to help with providing dairy products to families in need during the Covid crisis. She and her husband, Glen have a dairy farm and they donated milk to United Ministries for families who need milk for their family.

As you can see, we have been busy helping our neighbors during this crisis. We hope to be able to meet again in August.

# 2022 - 2024 PROJECT IN COMMON WITH NVON




