

International Day of Awareness of Food Loss and Waste September 29th is observed and is co-convened by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP). The day's goal is to raise awareness of food loss and waste, and to promote action to reduce it.




As school starts back, please encourage all students to learn everything that they can learn. An education is something that nobody can take away from you. I also pray that all students have a safe year in school.
